

# SPIRITUAL LEADERSHIP IS NOT EASILY DEFINED, BUT YOU CAN TELL WHEN IT IS PRESENT, AND ITS IMPACT IS POWERFUL.

The book of Acts records that when the early church began to grow, there were too few leaders able to care for the growing converts and all the needs arising, especially among the poor and widows. The Bible notes that more leaders were needed. "Brothers, choose seven men from among you who are known to be full of the Spirit and wisdom. We will turn this responsibility over to them" (Acts 6:3). Ellen G White in *The Acts of the Apostles* records that "The appointment of the seven to take the oversight of special lines of work, proved a great blessing to the church" (AA, 89.2). Under the wise leadership of these spiritual leaders, who "labored unitedly in the power of the Holy Spirit, the work committed to the gospel messengers was developing rapidly" (AA 88.2).



For us called to minister in Adventist Education, Spiritual Leadership remains a crucial component in helping to meet the goals of our work also. There are four essential criteria placed upon our schools: 1) To provide genuine education in that it continues throughout the life span – we need to be lifelong learners for whom learning becomes second nature; 2) it includes

the development of all the powers of the body, giving us the best chance of a fulfilled life; 3) it prepares the person for ministry, and educates for service; and 4) it considers eternity, emphasising the development of character. The relationships between these interconnected principles should emphasise the importance of spiritual leadership for each of us as stewards of Adventist Education and the children in our care, binding together the various interests of our schools into a united whole.

Importantly, it is evident there is one key element in the Spiritual Leaders' tool kit that is paramount: they need to be in close relationship with God. One cannot fill another's cup when our own cup is not full. Time and again we see Jesus in the Bible withdraw to spend time alone with God. Our Lord and Saviour found time to be alone with God 'very early in the morning,' in the evening' and even 'spent the night praying to God'. This time mattered to Jesus – this is how he began (Mark 1:12) and ended (Mark 14:32) his ministry. It should matter to us also. "Come with me by yourselves to a quiet place and get some rest" (Mark 6:31-32).

Many a book emphasises that the Christian should make his constant earnest prayer that becoming more like Christ would ever increasingly be incorporated into his or her own personality. Spiritual leadership requires that we examine ourselves, and that we deeply consider the character of our Lord. Jesus demonstrated five-character traits important to Spiritual Leadership that readily emerge best from an exploration of the Bible.

Firstly, we see that true leadership involves serving others. In Mark 10:45 we hear Jesus say "For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve others and to give his life as a ransom for many". We see him wash the feet of the disciples, demonstrating humility and the importance of serving others (John 13:1-17).

Secondly, Jesus showed deep compassion and empathy towards people. He healed the sick, comforted the mourning, and reached out to the marginalised and oppressed. His interactions with individuals like the woman at the well (John 4:1-42) and the woman caught in adultery (John 8:1-11) exemplify his compassion and understanding.

Thirdly, Jesus consistently upheld moral principles, challenging hypocrisy and injustice. He fearlessly confronted religious leaders who prioritised rules over compassion (Matthew 21:1-36) and stood against the exploitation of the vulnerable (Matthew 21:12-13).

Fourthly, Jesus empowered his disciples and encouraged them to grow in faith and leadership. He invested time in teaching and mentoring them, imparting spiritual wisdom and preparing them to carry on his mission (Matthew 28:19-20).

Lastly, Jesus exemplified obedience to God's will and unwavering faith. He prayed fervently for guidance and for strength (Luke 22:42) and consistently sought to fulfill his divine purpose (John 4:34).

Thus we see Jesus' model of spiritual leadership emphasises humility, compassion, integrity, empowerment, and faithfulness to God. Is it time that we considered these character traits of Jesus more fully in an effort to better understand how we also can live out spiritual leadership? The book *Education* states simply: "The work of education and the work of redemption are one" (White, 30.2). The goal of our work is laid out clearly and simply. Now is the time to 'labor unitedly'.
